Pulpwood and Chip Specifications

Pulpwood

- Length 100 in.
- Min dia. 4 in.
- Max dia. 20 in THI 18 in MOS
- Straight, flush knots, square ends
- Green (live) wood

Softwood Species

- THI All Species except Cedar
- MOS All Species except Cedar, Hemlock or Tamarack
- THI Restricted Species Balsam / Spruce / Tamarack 20% max

Chip Specifications

- Overs > 10mm
- Accepts 2 10mm
- Pins / Fines < 2mm
- Bark < .5%

Unacceptable Criteria

Plastic, Metal, Stone

Unacceptable Criteria

- Charred, Wormholes, Decayed, Crotched
- Excessive crook (over 20 in. / 18in)
- Plastic, Metal, Stone, Sticks and Branches

Hardwood Species

- All Northern Hardwood
- Restricted Species
 - Oak 30% (THI Only)
 - Butternut, Hickory
- Prohibited Species
 - Both Mills
 - Aspen, Basswood, Box Elder, Balm-of-Gilead, Cottonwood and Willow
 - MOS
 - Oak






Oversize

Reasons for Specifications



What is Chain of Custody?

•Forest Certification is a voluntary process to assess that a forest is managed according to the acceptable standards of sustainable forest management.



- •Chain-of-Custody (CoC) Certification is the act of tracking and recording the possession and transfer of fiber from its point of origin through the supply chain
 - Documented Control Procedures
 - Annual 3rd party audit

Chain of Custody Demand

 18 months – dramatic increase in demand for FSC certified product.



- Where / Why?
 - Mostly on food product side of the business
 - Increase in product to Europe
 - Suspect decrease in focus on Publication **Papers**



How does Chain of Custody work inside Expera?

- Credits originate from a Certified Forest
- Certified wood must purchased by a certified buyer / operator
- FSC Wood must not be mixed with non certified wood at an intermediate location
- Correct paperwork must accompany each load Identifying the COC # and the location of the Contract Area
- Ownership of must be maintained by a certified body for the credits to be passed.
